Friends Forever

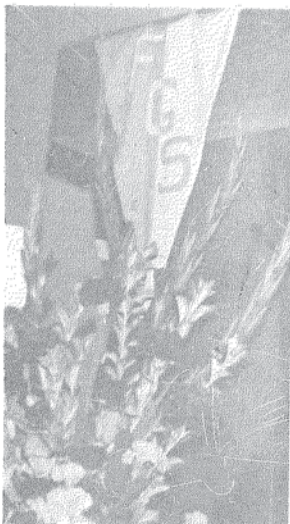
Friends Girls School in Ramallah was founded in 1889. It is a missionary school founded by the Quakers.

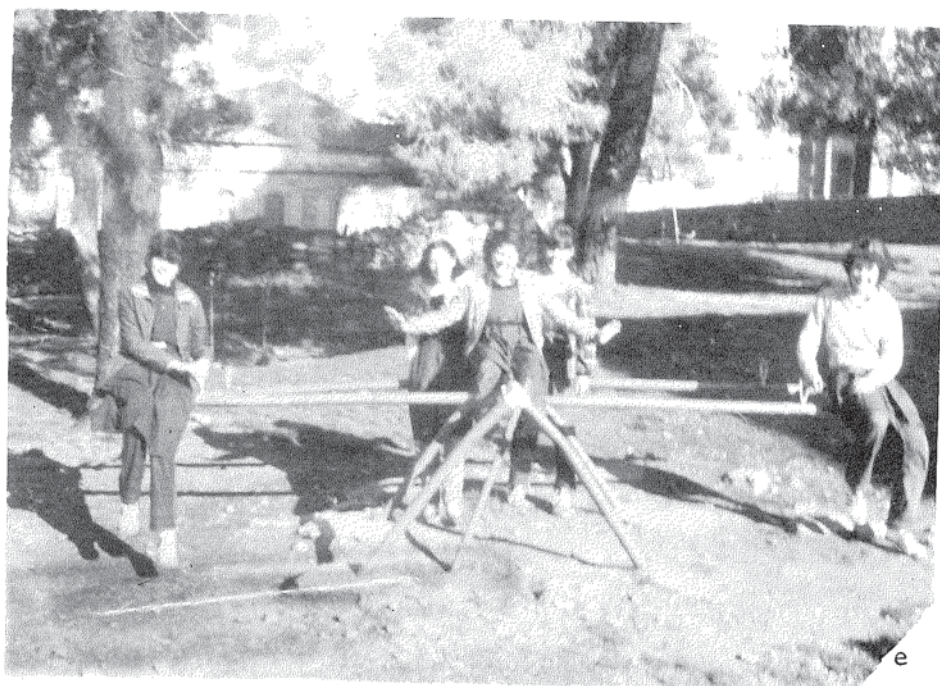


PREP 3

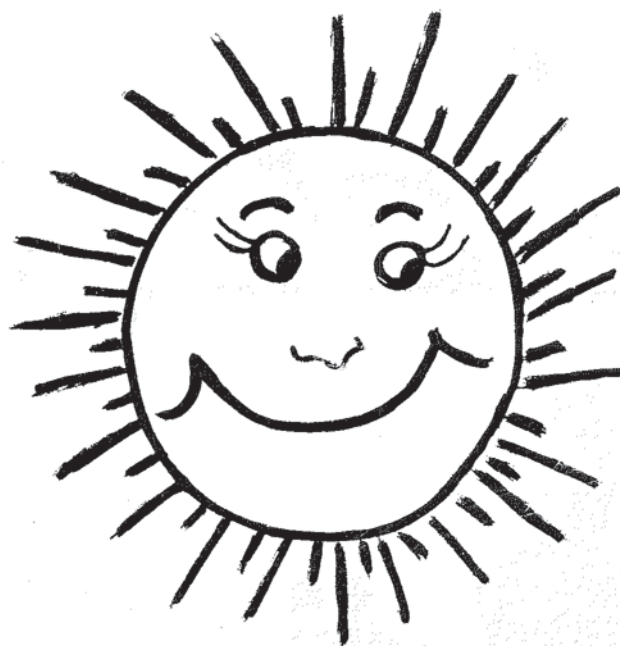

The Student Association also sponsored social events such as the bonfire and the school trip to Eilat. All were successful and gave a great deal of enjoyment to the entire student body.

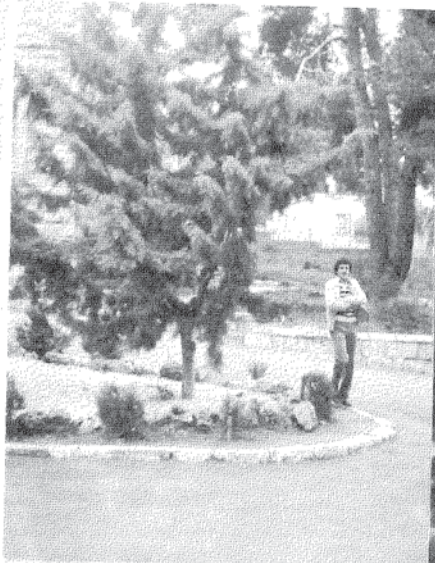

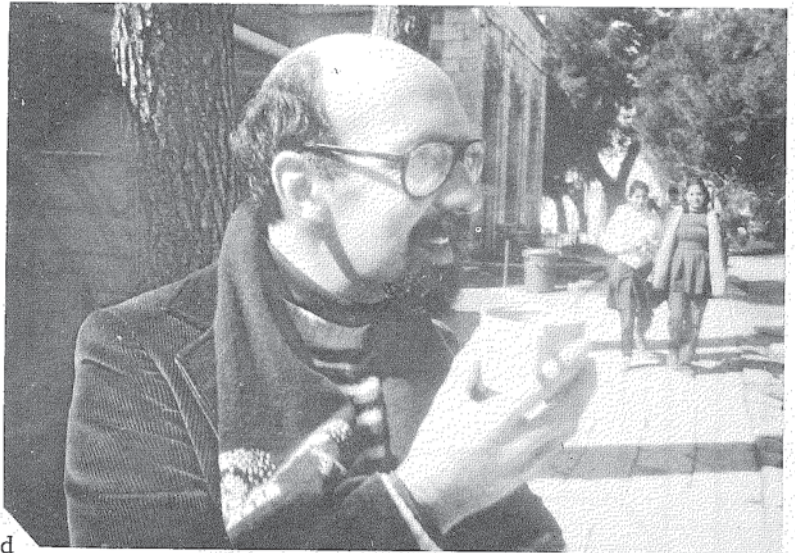

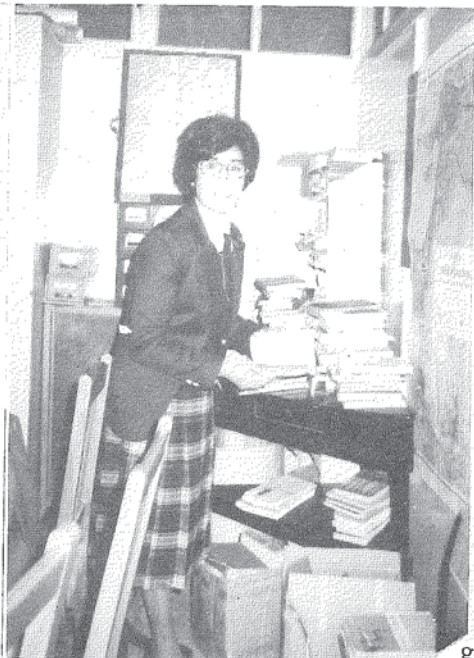
Hopefully, these activities will continue and become bigger and better in the future. Even though this was the first year for many of these, they were great motivation for student involvement and enthusiasm.
