History of the Friends Girls School



Old view of FGS

Under the name «Girls Training Home of Ramallah», the Friends Girls School first opened its doors in October, 1889. The Friends who actually founded the school, on behalf of New England Yearly Meeting, were Timothy Hussey and his sister Sarah. Their problem was indeed a challenging one, since the country at that time was not interested in education for girls. Surmounting these difficulties, the first graduating class received their diplomas in 1895.

Miss Katie Gabriel, a young woman from Kafirshima in the Lebanese Mountains, who had received her education in an English Mission in Shimlan, served as the first headmistress of the Girls Training School. She remained headmistress until 1906, when Alice Whittier Jones, a young woman from New England, arrived to share the administrative responsibilities.

At the outbreak of the First World War, the Girls Training School, like many private schools, was closed. The school was not opened as an educational institution until five years later when it re-opened under the name Friends Girls School. The years to follow bore witness to many changes in the school plant, beginning under the direction of Timothy Hussey and ending in the construction of Whittier Hall. The English speaking section was added in 1958-59. This division was initiated to educate those children who could not understand the subject matter taught in Arabic, thus enabling the school to broaden its area of service. Noticable progress has taken place in the school since its conception. The high standard of education has given it a prominent position in the area of private schools. In 1963 the school adopted an American system of education, adding an additional year to its curriculum. The school has succeeded in its task of preparing young girls for the role of mature and educated women of the twentieth century.

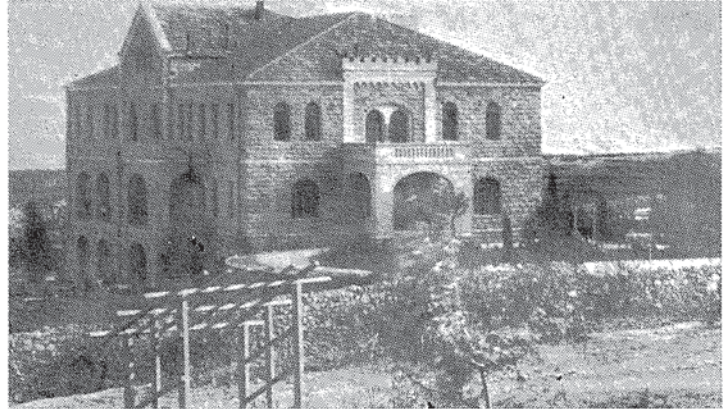

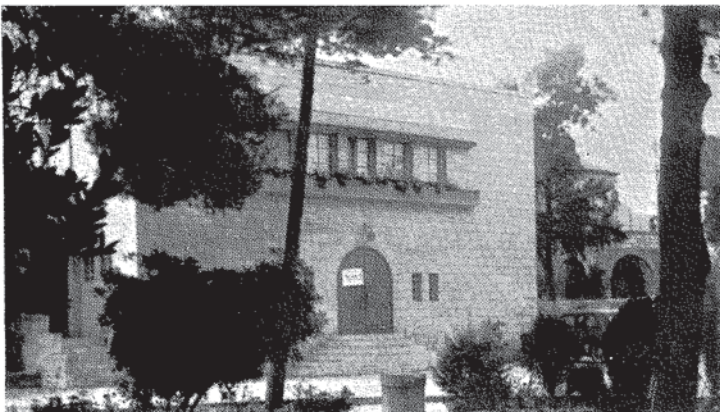
History of the Friends Boys School

Old View of FBS



In 1900, following the wishes of the New England Yearly Meeting, a training school for boys was established in Ramallah. Under the leadership of Elihu and Almy Chase Grant the «Boys Training Home» was opened, its first home being in rented buildings. Eighty students applied for admission during the first year, but only thirty students could be facilitated. In 1903 Elihu Grant, retiring from the position of headmaster, was replaced by A. Edward Kelsey, who served as headmaster until 1912. The year 1912 witnessed the first student enrolled in the school, Khalil Totah, as headmaster. Mr. Totah served as headmaster for only two years at the conclusion of which he completed his military training and migrated to the United States.

In 1914 the main building of the Training School was constructed. At the outbreak of the First World War the school was closed. It first served as the home of the Turkish Mudir, then was used as a hospital for the armed forces. The present school dining room was used at that time as a stable for Turkish horses. At the conclusion of the war in 1919, the school was re-opened as an educational institution — the Friends Boys School. Ensuing years saw the construction of additional buildings on the campus. Grant Hall was completed in 1934, serving as a residence for the headmaster in addition to being a dormitory for elementary boys. The auditorium with an additional classroom wing was finished in 1939. The school is presently serving approximately 250 students from varying backgrounds and cultures. The school has attempted to achieve a high degree of academic excellence, and to prepare its students to be useful and dedicated citizens.

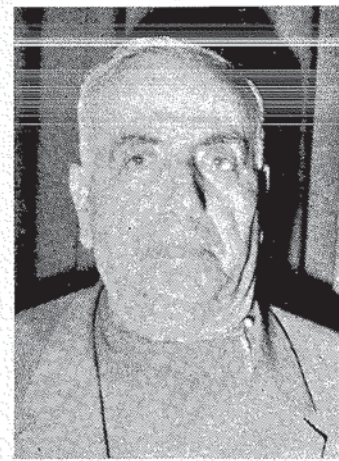
DEDICATION

Mr. Farid Tabri

Mr. Farid Tabri was born in Salt, a village on the Eastern Bank of Jordan, in 1898. He spent his first years of education at Schneller School, a school run by a German mission and previously known as the «Syrian Orphanage». At Schneller, he completed his elementary and secondary education plus a two year «Seminar», thus graduating as a teacher. During his educational career in this school, Mr. Tabri was known to be a very energetic person who could participate in any kind of sports. In 1920, he entered the Friends Boys School in Ramallah as a teacher of Arabic. At FBS, he was known to be a man of great endurance who could go to Hebron on foot. In 1920, Mr. Tabri went to Egypt where he continued his studies for one more year in the Egyptian University and the High Science Institute in Cairo. Until the year 1953, Mr. Tabri remained in his post as head of the Arabic Department at FBS, when at that time he was asked by Mr. Reynolds, then principal, to assume the post of vice president. He rejected the offer and accepted the position of Dean of Students, in addition to his work as an instructor of Arabic. Thus, by the end of this year, he will have spent forty-six complete years at FBS.



Mr. Awad Khoury

Mr. Awad Khoury was born in 1892, in Jefna, a small village six miles north of Ramallah. At that time, the problem of education was a tough one. Very few schools existed, and most of them belonged to foreign missions. Mr. Khoury had his elementary and secondary education in one of these mission schools, the Greek Orthodox Church School in Jerusalem. After graduating from this school, he studied for two years in the Theological School in Jerusalem, and for six years in the Economic Institute of Jaffa. Immediately after graduation, he was summoned by the government to work with the army in Biershaba'a. He worked there for two years, starting in 1916. In 1920, and three months after Mr. Tabri's entrance into the Friends Boys School, he began working in the school as a teacher of geography. Though geography was and still is his line, he taught many other subjects including math, history, ethics, and art. Being such a versatile teacher he has been indispensable to the school.

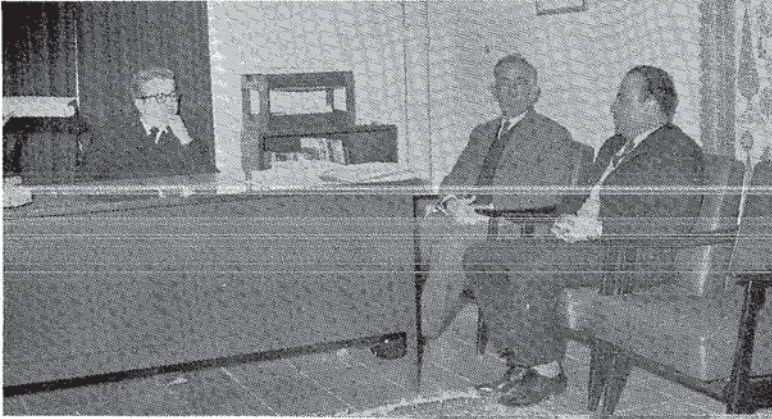

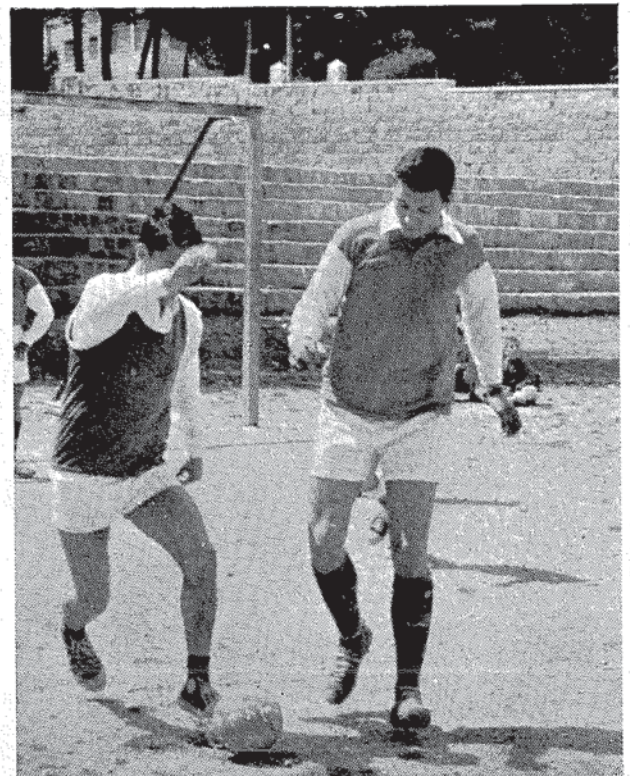


SPORTS ACTIVITIES

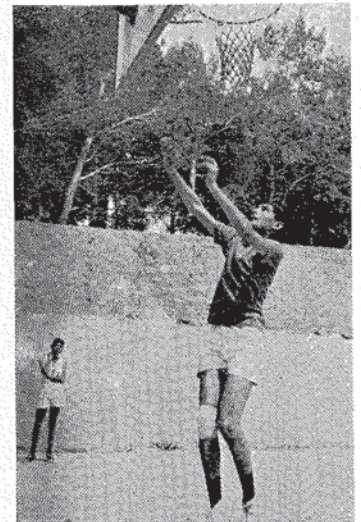

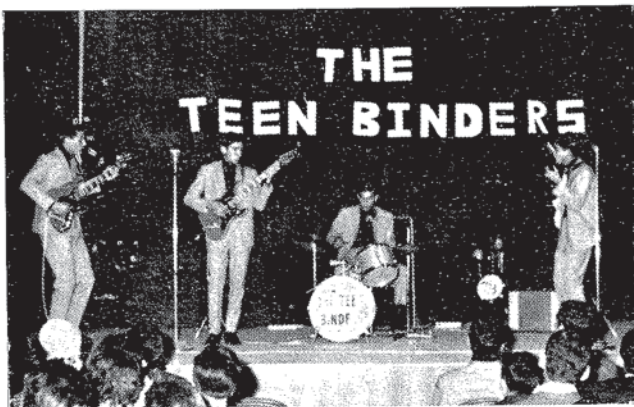
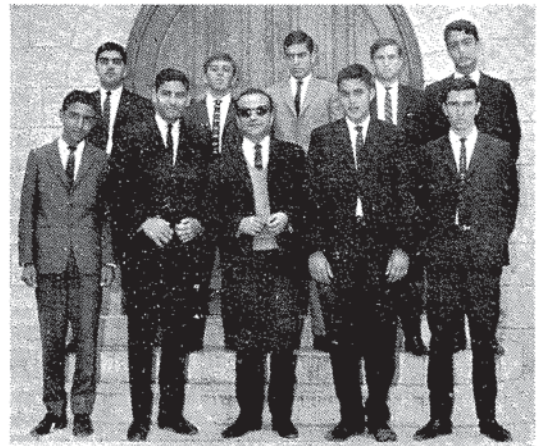

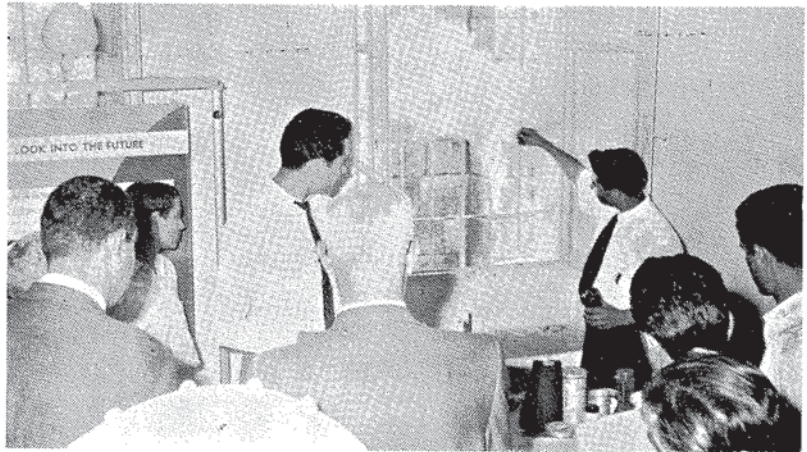
