History

To write a history of Friends Girls School is to touch the memories of those women who were students of FGS, whose mothers, grandmothers, and great grandmothers were "Girls School girls". It is to weave a tapestry of a hundred years of Palestinian womanhood. It is to remember those happy, joyous, tearful, wonderfully difficult days of being school girls.

To write a history of Friends Girls School is to chronicle the lives of women... those strong, independent, dedicated women... who sparked with a dream, fanned that dream into blazing reality. It is to write of Quaker women from American farming communities, Lebanese women from the towns of the Lebanese mountains, Palestinian women from the villages of Palestine. It is to write of women striving to improve their lives and the lives of their sisters and daughters... to improve the lives of their husbands, fathers, brothers and sons... to improve the live of the wider community of which they were a part. It is to write of growth and maturity, of realizing potential; it is to write of love.


In the Palestine of 1869, as in much of the rural world, most of the women were unschooled. They were educated through experience. They were skilled in tending children, caring for families, toiling in the fields, working in the house, carrying the burdens placed upon them by birth and tradition. It was in 1869 that Eli and Sybil Jones, Quakers from China, Main visited Ramallah. They were touched by the lives of the women in this small Palestinian village. They saw there were schools for boys, but no school for girls. To quote their journal entry of that time: "We felt for the girls who had to carry the burdens and had no chance".

It was this concern to "give girls a chance" that they carried back to New England Yearly Meeting of Friends (Quakers). There it was met with apporval and the first day school for girls was opened shortly after. This school, the first of a number of small village schools for girls Quakers opened, was taught by Miriam Bayouk of Bireh. (A fifteen year old girl who had had several years of schooling in a Jerusalem school).

It wasn't until twenty years later in 1889 that enough funds were available to establish a boarding school for girls in Ramallah. Starting with only twelve girls and a Lebanese principal, Miss Katie Gabriel, the Girls Training Home (later renamed the Friends Girls School) opened its doors to the "girlhood of Palestine". Inspite of many obstacles (not the least in being, convincing fathers that girls could be educated!) the reputation of the spirit of the Girls Training Home and the caliber of its education grew. Gradually, girls were coming from all over Palestine to attend the Girls Training Home.

The end of World War I marked the end of centuries of Turkish rule and the birth of the British Mandate in Palestine; 1948 — the end of Mandate and the Partition of Palestine; 1967 — Occupation of the West Bank and Gaza; 1987 — the beginning of the *intifada*. The century of Friends Girls School's existence has been a century of war and political unrest, of changing governments and occupations, of struggle for independence and self-determination, a century of challenge and opportunity for Palestinian women.

Many changes have taken place at FGS during this century of turmoil and struggle. Library books were burned to warm retreating Turkish soldiers; the piano was hauled off by music loving Brits, later to be retrieved from a desert plain near Jericho; the buildings housed dozens of Palestinians fleeing the coastal cities in 1948... one refugee child was born in a classroom; new building have been erected; the library has been enlarged; the science lab has been improved; computer classes and an Arts Program have been added to the curriculum; the boarding section has been closed; a large number of Palestinian-Americans have joined the student body; on and on, snatches of memory, facts of change can be added to the history that is Friends Girls School. No longer is FGS a primary financial project of Friends United Meeting in America, but an institution dependent on tuition and gifts for its financial existence. No longer is FGS directly guided by Friends United Meeting, but an institution under the guiding hand of a local Board of Directors.

For a hundred years the graduates of Friends Girls School have made a difference in the communities of which they were and are a part. They have filled the traditional roles of wives and mothers, as well as becoming: teachers, doctors, lawyers, political analysists, college professors, authors, artists, social workers, musicians, counselors, TV directors, principals, newscasters, religious leaders, nurses, cabinet ministers, engineers. They still carry the burdens placed upon them, as well as those they *choose* to carry, but what a *chance* they have been given!

A school is more than buildings and desks and books on a shelf. It is more than just pupils, and principal and staff. It is more than a romanticized history of what was. A school is a spirit that moves and breathes with a life of its own. It is a caring, growing and loving that matures, that educates, that assists the girl in becoming the woman she is meant to be.

For a century Friends Girls School has moved with a spirit of tolerance and love. The Moslem and Christian girls who have been part of this sisterhood *know* what that spirit is. They *know* there is an uniqueness, a specialness, of having been part of Friends Girls School.

In a letter written by a former graduate, teacher and principal of FGS these lines are found:

"The little seed planted in love and faith 75 years ago has grown into a huge tree sending out intelligent, dependable and responsible women, filling out positions in all walks of life.

We have every right to be proud of our *alma mater*. I am sure you will join me in fervent hopes that the doors will be open, not only for the coming seventy-five years, but for many, many seventy-five years to come".

And in this Centennial Year of 1989, that is certainly the hope... the hope that Friends Girls School can survive to continue to be a leader in education for Palestinian women.

Alice Jones' Commencement Address to the Class of 1928


Class of 1928: You have come to perhaps the happiest moment of our school life, the moment to which you have long looked forward, and for which you have worked. It is right that you should feel glad. But there are few joys in life that have no shadows. Your gladness has a tinge of sadness in it; you will miss your school and your school will miss you. Life is ever-changing. We end one thing only to begin another. And every beginning is very important because the end depends so much on how we begin.

You are now to enter upon a larger life than you have yet lived a life of increasing responsibility. You have your dreams of what you want that life to be. Certainly you want it to be a success. If I should ask you what you mean by success; what you consider the most important thing in life; I wonder what you would answer. I once heard a sermon where the preacher asked that question, and then paused for us to think out our answers. Probably no two of us were thinking the same thing. But when he gave his answer, I think we all felt that he was right... that his answer was bigger than any of our's perhaps, yet included them all. He said that the most important thing in life is to know God. God has put within each one of us a deep longing, a dissatisfaction, because He wants us to be satisfied with nothing less than Himself. "God has made us for Himself, and the heart never rests until it finds its rest in Him".

It is this longing for God... this trying to find Him, that we call "the eternal search," because it never ends. Every soul must find God for himself, and every soul must be ever finding Him anew. To the soul that is searching God is ever revealing Himself in new ways, and is ever becoming more wonderful and more beautiful. But we must have our ears and our eyes and our hearts wide open or we may miss Him.

... Dear girls, God is ever close to every one of us, but it is easy, very easy to be so absorbed with little things that we miss the biggest thing of all. You have at times felt God, you have spoken to Him, and you have heard His voice, but your acquaintance with Him has only just begun. He will speak to you in a thousand ways if you but listen. In a thousand ways He will show Himself to you, if you will but look. Over and over you will feel Him near... if you want Him.

Go forth then to your search, ever seeking, ever finding, and life shall be a success and the best shall be yours.






كريمة ناصر (١٩٢٦)





Friends Girls School. It would be insufficient to describe FGS as a school, alma mater would be a more appropriate description. In a society where womyn are discriminated against and considered as the second sex, FGS has made a big difference in our lives.

For many womyn of Friends Girls School, the school has been the only place where we have been allowed to be ourselves without being rejected or judged. We have been allowed to explore, be different, and most importantly, to freely find ourselves. By the time we have graduated, we will at least have some perspective of who we are.

The true uniqueness and significance of Friends Grils School lies in the fact that it began its liberation struggle decades ago. This struggle was for the liberation of womyn, and we cannot deny that this is vital to national liberation. We have been educated in a school which put very few restrictions on us due to our sex. We were people with dreams, with hopes, with ambitions... and nobody made fun of us when we said we wanted to make a difference in the Palestinian future. We were asked to articulate ourselves more clearly. Nobody mocked us. The "sky was the limit" and we could "Expand our horizons".


We were made conscience of the circumspect situation women live under (and being Palestinian, we already know of the circumspect situation we live under). So in our cry for liberation, we're asking for liberation in all its forms.

With all confidence and assurance, I say farewell to the day the kitchen was the farthest a womyn got. I say farewell because I know I am capable of making a difference. I've learned to be confident, because I was educated in an environment in which confidence came naturally.

I see the future and it looks bright. The liberation of Palestine is unique, because it is liberation in its truest sense. The day will come!

No longer are we the sisters and mothers of the nationalists, martyrs, and prisoners. We are them. And even before the *intifada*, before the revolution, we knew we could be them, because we were the womyn of Palestine.

Thank you, Friends Girls School for not destroying my dreams and for helping me solidify the pillars.





Friends Girls School Alumna

The following pages include the pictures (when available) of the graduating classes of FGS. There were no graduating classes between 1914-1921 when the schools were closed due to the First World War. The women who would have graduated during this time period are also part of the Girls School Alumna, though their names are not listed.

Through scanning the lists of alumna it can be noticed how FGS has been a family school. In many cases, girls, their sisters, mothers, aunts, grandmothers, and in two or three instances their great grandmothers, have been students and graduates of Friends Girls School.

There are many former students whose names are not listed here, their having left FGS before graduating to get married or to move abroad. These women, though technically having not graduated from the Girls School, *are* a part of the FGS family of alumna.

Among many of the graduates you will find women who returned to FGS to serve as teachers, secretaries, librarians, members of the Local Board of Directors, and in two cases, to serve as headmistress.

Following a chronological, pictorical display of graduating classes, is an alphabetical listing of alumna with their year of graduation in brackets.

(This Centennial Year of 1989, the oldest living graduate is Wadeah Garabidian Kattan (1912). Her granddaughter-in-law, Abla Kameel Nasir (69) is the current acting principal of Friends Grils School).
