
responsibility.



The Educational Network was established by the RFS in 1990 as a project with three objectives: 1) help protect Palestinian education from the Israeli military's continuous and prolonged area-wi school closures; 2) to help Palestinian teachers function effectively in the classroom; and 3) to hel develop Palestinian education into a viable system that meets the needs of Palestinian society. Through i executive committee, composed of representatives from the three teachers' unions in the Ramall district, it hopes to introduce innovative teaching methods and course materials into t curriculum.

To help link Palestinian teachers, the Network holds workshops and annual conferences, initiat teachers development projects and meetings to unify the work among the teachers' unions a educational organizations, and co-edits the bi-weekly educational page in Al-Quds newspaper. To rai awareness and understanding abroad of the problems facing Palestinian education and to gather forei support for Palestinian education, the Network publishes newsletters in English for worldwidistribution, sends teachers abroad to meet with educators, hosts foreign delegations, and gives lectur to foreign visitors.




