Students, your positive outlook and hard work will not be forgotten. To the seventh graders who will leave us for FBS, I say, "We will miss you."



CHARITABLE ACTIVITIES

Each year Miss Lena's students visit a variety of social agencies and charitable societies, in order to increase students' awareness of social issues and the needs of others in their community.

Q: What is the interaction like between your students and the people you visit?

Miss Lena: Usually, the hosts' responses are great. They wait for our visits; one time when the Ramallah Women's Union was putting out their Christmas tree they asked "When are the FGS students coming to visit us?" because usually at that time each year the students visit them. Our students were pleased with the services that the refugee authorities give to the refugees.

Q: What were the places you visited?

Miss Lena: The Society for the Blind in El Bireh, The Women's Union of Ramallah, and The Society for the Preservation of the Family in El Bireh. We are also planning to visit the Abu Raya hospital for the victims of the *Intifada* in Ramallah.

GIRLS' EDUCATION WORKSHOP






"Chapel" 1994-1995
