HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL

The history of Ramallah Friends School (RFS) is one closely tied with the history of Palestine. In its checkered political history RFS has served not only as schools, but also as a center for refugees, hospital, and a center for community lectures, concerts and other cultural activities.

The Ottoman Empire

In Palestine, Friends work began in 1869 with a number of small schools for girls in the villages surrounding Ramallah. In October 1889, Friends Girls School was officially opened. A Boys Training Home was founded in 1901.

First World War

Turkish and later British troops occupied school buildings and British troops used the Boys School as a hospital in 1917.

British Mandate

Electric light was first used at the schools in 1923 and male students first took the Palestinian Matriculation examination in Jerusalem in 1926.

Nakba/ Catastrophe 1948

The Friends Meeting House and both campuses became the temporary home for refugees. Student numbers swelled to accommodate refugees from the coastal cities and the White Gifts program was instituted to give foodstuffs and money to refugee families.

Jordanian Rule

The School had a relatively peaceful life during the Jordanian period from 1948-1967.

Israeli Occupation

The boarding sections in both schools were closed as students from neighboring countries were no longer able to come. In 1990, the campus of the Girls School became a co-educational Elementary School and Kindergarten and the campus of the Boys School became a co-educational High School.

Palestinian National Authority

Following the Oslo agreements, the uneasy peace brought greater stability to the School. The second Intifada began in September 2000 and RFS became exposed to a new level of violence with sequences of nightly shelling from Israeli tanks and light artillery and attacks by helicopter gunners. Following the Israeli pullout from parts of Ramallah and El-Bireh in 2003, School services have remained uninterrupted.

Modern Day

In 1999, the School became accredited by the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO), offering students in Palestine for the first time an IB Diploma Program. Today, after receiving the IB authorization of the Middle Years Program (MYP) in 2012 (for grades 6 through 10), and the Primary Years Program (PYP) in 2018 (for grades LKG through 5th), RFS is recognized as an IB World School.

Progress and resilience continue to distinguish RFS as an "oasis of hope" for the Palestinian people. In 2019, together as one community, Ramallah Friends School celebrates its 150th anniversary.


SENIOR MOMENTS

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Friends,

Every year, I struggle writing this letter to you. While I try to come up with some profound wisdom to share, all that continues to come to my mind are the endless to do lists that must get done by the end of the year. For those of us who are in the trenches, it is difficult to reflect on the year, when we are deafened by the demands of the daily school life.

On this sunny Sunday afternoon, my mind drifts to grade 12 students who have two officials tomorrow and my stomach takes a slight tumble as I worry for them for just a minute. Then, I quickly remind myself that they are working hard and that is the best they can do. I just pray that they cultivate the results of this hard work, because it has been a difficult year indeed. Much like a marathon, and God knows that the last 5K are the hardest!



Then the teachers come to mind and their daily schedules. I am amazed that someone would choose to wake up every morning to a job that entails working with other people's children. Yet it seems to me that a teacher's job is still not fully understood. See I dream of a school that is run more like a hospital where teachers are treated like surgeons, and the school structure offers a tiered staffing with attending, resident and intern teachers. A place where teachers will find all the support they need from the moment they decide to become a teacher, to the moment they retire. In return, they will give the students all the support that they need.

It is no secret that this year was particularly difficult, but it is also important to remember that we are a family, and members of a family may disagree. Their disagreements are always rooted in love. At RFS one cannot help but feel like they are part of something bigger.

As an alumnus of the school, it is truly a unique opportunity to serve our community. I feel like I have become a mother of seven hundred plus students overnight. I feel blessed to come in every morning to see all the smiling faces. Thank you for your continued support, patience, and trust. I hope to continue to serve our community to the best of my abilities.

I am proud to lead this relationship as Clerk of the Board of Trustees. My long term relationship involves generations of my family. A school where my mother attended, I attended and my children have attended. A school I wish my grandchildren to attend. I value the influence the school has had upon my family, and community. The trust that this school provides for all Palestinians has enabled a future for Palestinian leadership to seek the best education possible and return to give back.

Developing a school such as ours embodying the Quaker values is complicated. We offer the best of international education. A community which is challenged by occupation, suffering from depression and unemployment, struggling to put food on the table. We have been occupied until we no longer know what it is to be unoccupied, struggling to ensure the prolonged occupation does not lead to the wrongful annexation by the occupier. A teaching community isolated from other leading schools around the world. Yet together we succeed. We are Sumoud.

I'm trying to imagine the encounters that Sybil Jones of China Maine had when she traveled among the Christian villages in the hills north of Jerusalem in 1869. I'm imagining her delight in meeting the girls and women, with their beautiful embroidery and their infectious smiles. I'm imagining her heartbreak at hearing that these women had limited access to education, and couldn't teach their daughters to read.

And I'm imagining the response of the Quakers back home in New England, when Sybil returned to tell her stories and share her concerns. These Friends felt keenly what Sybil had also felt – that when one member of the body of Christ suffers, all suffer, and when one member rejoices, all rejoice together. And so together they committed themselves to provide access to education for the girls of the Palestinian hills.

Now, 150 years later, Friends are still joined together in a global fellowship of solidarity and commitment, in which the things that happen in one place, affect us all. Ramallah Friends School continues to be a focus of the prayers and sacrificial giving of Quakers from around the world. In this anniversary year in which we reaffirm the Quaker identity of the school, the commitment of Friends remains as strong as ever.

Friends United Meeting is proud to serve as the institutional home of RFS, and we do so as a sacred duty on behalf of the worldwide community of Friends. God has truly blessed the efforts of those who have gone before us, and has entrusted to us the care of this special school for this reason, for the sake of those who will come after us.

To the graduating class of 2019, I say this: be faithful to the trust that this school, with its extraordinary history, has placed in you. Be the unique and precious person that God made you to be, because God needs you to be authentically yourself. Go into the world and make it a better place. Hold tenaciously to that vision of the Peaceable Kingdom of God that you glimpsed during your RFS years. Make your school and your community proud. Give back to those who invested in you, and pay it forward by investing in others. Be the Sybil Jones of your generation.
